Founded in 2019, the Greater Los Angeles Education Foundation is the primary philanthropic partner of the Los Angeles County Office of Education, dedicated to supporting its mission across 80 school districts.

As the only regional education foundation in the county, GLAEF addresses critical public education challenges by fostering systems-level innovation, building cross-sector partnerships, and encouraging creative problem-solving. The Foundation's initiatives are built in collaboration with LACOE and draw on the strengths of local schools, district partners, community leaders, and other stakeholders, positioning GLAEF at the heart of public-private partnerships in education.

OUR STORY

GLAEF began as Friends of LACOE, a supporting organization that worked to provide resources for comprehensive educational services, including supportive learning environments and specialized instruction. Recognizing the unique position to serve as a regional connector, the Friends of LACOE Board worked with philanthropic and community partners to make a strategic investment and intentionally restructure the organization to build the Greater Los Angeles Education Foundation.

Today, GLAEF has grown to include a dedicated team of eight full-time employees, all passionate and devoted to advancing our mission. With a shared vision and deep commitment to making a difference, we strive to ensure that our work not only impacts lives today, but also builds a sustainable future for generations to come.

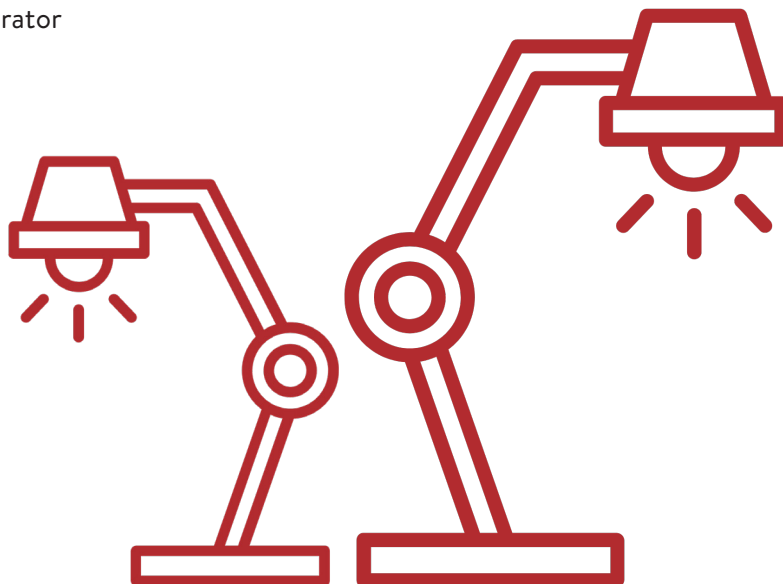

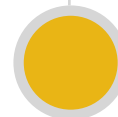
Seeking to increase collective problem-solving and innovative solutions for today's complex learning environment, Greater Los Angeles Education was formed.

The Board hired Kerry Lynn Franco to leverage catalytic philanthropy & advance deeper collaboration between schools and communities.

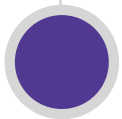

Secured \$2.5M in philanthropic funding to support a multi-year commitment to expand community schools across the region.



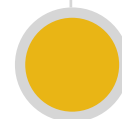

2023-2024 HIGHLIGHTS

GLAEF celebrated significant accomplishments and milestones that advanced our mission of educational equity across Los Angeles County.

One of the standout achievements was the grand opening of multiple **Teen Tech Centers**, a partnership with the Best Buy Foundation, the Annenberg Foundation, the County of Los Angeles, and other community leaders under the **Los Angeles Community Impact Hub** (LA CIH) network. These centers provide students with access to cutting-edge technology and resources, helping to bridge the digital divide and prepare youth for success in LA's creative economy.



This year also marked the debut of the **Young Innovators Accelerators (YIA) Pitch Competition**, where 30 talented young innovators from three Best Buy Teen Tech Centers in South LA, Westlake, and East LA presented creative solutions to real-world challenges, with the winners receiving funding and mentorship to bring their ideas to life.



GLAEF proudly established the **LACOE Signature Fund @GLAEF**, a new sponsorship platform designed to mobilize philanthropic support for LACOE-led convenings, professional development training and meetings, teacher appreciation activities, and other events and programs as needed. The platform equips LACOE with essential financial resources to conceptualize, strategize, and execute events and vital engagement opportunities across LA County.

GLAEF partnered with LACOE to host the **3rd annual Green Schools Symposium**, a leadership event that delved into the crucial intersection of environmental and human sustainability in education. The event brought together educators, administrators, and community members eager to advance eco-friendly learning environments.



2023-2024 HIGHLIGHTS



In May, we held our inaugural **Philanthropy Summit for Public Education**, which convened leaders from education, philanthropy, and government to collaborate on strategies that support student success throughout the region. We are pleased to have facilitated this gathering, bringing together districts and education foundations to exchange ideas and initiate discussions about our collective strength and the significance of philanthropy in education.



GLAEF kicked off its **Coffee Break Series**, a unique opportunity for LACOE employees and partners to engage in casual conversations. Through this series, GLAEF aims to provide participants with an in-depth understanding of the various programs and services at LACOE, in a relaxed and informal setting. The inaugural session spotlighted the impactful work of LACOE's Foster Youth Services Coordinating Program and its scholarship fund dedicated to cultivating the success of foster youth in Los Angeles County.



GLAEF also led and participated in impactful projects and partnerships that deepened our engagement with key stakeholders and the communities we serve.

A significant achievement was the release of the **LA County Toolkit to Equity-Centered Dual Enrollment Partnerships**, a critical resource supporting districts and colleges in creating equitable dual enrollment pathways. GLAEF hosted webinars and presented the toolkit at key events, like the LACOE CTE Symposium and LAUSD's Dual Enrollment Symposium. Additionally, with support from The Eli and Edythe Broad Foundation, GLAEF funded positions to expand LACOE's dual enrollment capacity, helping districts to adopt new programs.

2023–2024 HIGHLIGHTS



GLAEF, LACOE, and the LA County Department of Arts and Culture developed a comprehensive **Proposition 28 implementation plan** across 80 districts, providing support, strategic communication, and professional development. The year concluded with a celebration at the Getty, which highlighted the success of the Arts Education Community of Practice (CoP) and Prop 28's impact on equitable arts programs.

GLAEF is pleased to be the home of the **Inglewood Youth Education Fund**, a remarkable \$12.75M endowment dedicated to enhancing educational opportunities for youth in Inglewood, California. This substantial endowment will provide long-term support to nonprofit organizations and initiatives that address the educational needs of Inglewood's youth. By partnering directly with trusted community organizations, GLAEF aims to create a lasting and positive impact through a diverse range of educational programs.



GLAEF supported **LACOE's Community Schools Initiative** team by staffing key positions to expand the community school model, benefiting over 360,000 students through coaching, technical assistance, and participation in communities of practice. In addition, we awarded planning grants to eight districts, funding initiatives for community engagement, onsite events, and strategies for transitioning to the community school framework. A promotional video highlighting these efforts will be featured at upcoming regional events.



2023-2024 HIGHLIGHTS

GLAEF and LACOE along with other LA County leaders launched the **LA County Mandated Supporter Program** to improve the mandated reporter process for educators. Aligned with statewide and local policy, this program is intended to address the deeply problematic consequences of over-reporting students, especially African Americans. This initiative, including training and associated interventions across LA County, was formally launched in the Fall of 2024.

GLAEF partnered with LACOE to promote **EdTech** implementation across the region, focusing on generative AI tools. GLAEF supported the development of LACOE's AI Guidelines, which will guide technical assistance and educator engagement across districts. This summer, GLAEF hosted an AI Symposium for 175 educators and provided training to 6 LEAs. Additionally, GLAEF, USC Rossier School of Education, and LACOE launched the **LACOE EdTech Innovation Lab** to connect educators with tech solutions, facilitating hands-on learning and feedback loops for effective classroom implementation.

GLAEF, LACOE Head Start, and the Multilingual Academic Support Unit hosted the "Meet the Moment," convening to address the critical need for a robust PreK and TK educator workforce serving multilingual learners. Building on the momentum of the work, GLAEF, in partnership with the English Learner Workforce Investment Network (EL-WIN), launched the **EL-WIN initiative**, a pilot project aimed at strengthening regional partnerships between LEAs, colleges, early education providers, and local stakeholders to prioritize recruiting and preparing early educators, assessing community needs, and developing a collaborative agenda to ensure the successful development of a high-quality educator pipeline for multilingual learners.

CHARTING THE FUTURE

As we reflect on our achievements, GLAEF is excited to focus on scaling key initiatives and advancing new projects that promote educational equity across Los Angeles County in the coming year.

Through the Inglewood Youth Education Fund, we aim to foster student leadership and agency, providing access to resources and support that empower Inglewood youth to take control of their educational journeys by partnering directly with trusted community organizations. Programs to be funded by the new endowment include initiatives addressing After-School Tutoring, Youth Innovation and STEM Design Camps, Keeping Students in School, Opening Pathways to College, and College Scholarships. As GLAEF prepares to launch IYEF formally, we are engaging in focused conversations with the Inglewood community and conducting a landscape analysis that will inform the strategy and long-term goals for the grantmaking program.

Stitch is a dynamic, searchable database that connects district and school leaders, educators, and families with the vast and vibrant landscape of expanded learning opportunities in Greater Los Angeles. Stitch profiles diverse organizations across all disciplines, program types, and focus areas—all dedicated to serving LA County youth. For the 2024-25 school year, Stitch is also a central location to learn more about The Getty's PST ART: Art & Science Collide, profiling all PST ART educational programming, community events, and learning opportunities around exhibitions to integrate art into the classroom.

GLAEF aims to prioritize emerging areas that will shape our work in the years to come. We are committed to projects aligned with our ongoing efforts to strengthen the Foster Youth Services and Homeless Education Program and help vulnerable student populations overcome barriers to learning. These emerging areas include:

- **Advancing Health & Wellness in schools,** recognizing the critical role that mental and physical well-being plays in student success.
- **Green Schools and Sustainability** to promote energy efficiency, sustainability, and climate education, and student workforce development & career pathways.
- **Support LACOE's Reimagining Juvenile Court Schools,** ensuring that at-risk youth receive the academic and emotional support they need.

As we embark on these new initiatives, GLAEF remains steadfast in its strategic priorities: fostering educational innovation, supporting equitable learning environments, and building community partnerships that uplift all students.
